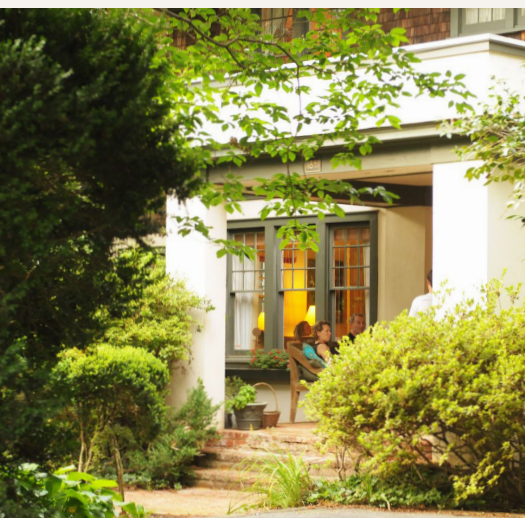

# Dream with Me: John M. Perkins

Little did we know how precious that fellowship would be, looking back upon the February weekend later after the pandemic pulled us all apart.

Dr. John M. Perkins, nationally revered community builder and longtime friend of Theological Horizons, came to Charlottesville for a series of final public appearances leading up to his 90th birthday.

The Dome Room of the Rotunda (pictured on the front page) was filled to capacity for his talk, "**Parting Thoughts on Race and Love**," sponsored with the Project on Lived Theology at the University of Virginia.

"**Dream with Me: An Afternoon of Storytelling, Music and Worship**" drew more than 500 people to the Martin Luther King, Jr., Performing Arts Center for music by the Charlottesville Worship Collective, testimonies by those transformed by Perkins's witness, and intimate reflections from Dr. Perkins himself.

Rounding out the three day weekend, Dr. Perkins paused for a house blessing at The Perkins House, an intentional residential community for UVa students. He shared wisdom on the practicalities of effecting change at **A Morning Workshop** on community development held at First Baptist on Main Street.

This historic weekend with Dr. John M. Perkins was also a milestone event for the Capps Lecture Series, marking the final lecture generously funded by Dr. and Mrs. W. 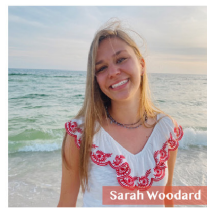

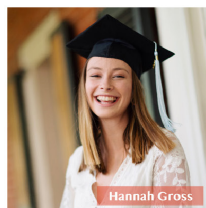

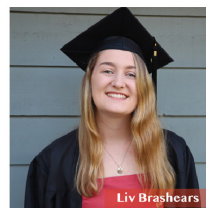
