At the University of Virginia, we revere the spirit of inquiry. Students challenge commonly held assumptions. Scholars penetrate the surface of things to search for deeper truths. During this past year of tragedy, controversy and violence at UVa, our questions went far beyond the academic to the deeply personal and spiritual.

Philip Yancey, a lifetime journalist with fifteen million books in print, came to our University as one who is always asking questions. Questions we polite UVa folks may not even dare to ask. To a standing room only crowd in Old Cabell Hall, Philip Yancey spoke words of truth and wisdom through his 2015 Capps Lecture in Christian Theology, "Two Themes That Haunt Me: Suffering and Grace".

Philip Yancey gave us permission to doubt and to rage in the face of suffering-and to acknowledge our thirst for grace in a competitive world of ungrace. Then he invited us all into a daring, thoughtful, honest faith: a faith that makes a difference for our world. Yancey reminded us of the words from Scripture, "See to it that no one misses the grace of God." He challenged we who are Christians to establish pioneer settlements of the Kingdom of God to show a different way of being human, a way that



operates by upside down rules, the rules of grace.

The Capps Lecture in Christian Theology is an annual lecture made possible by Dr. and Mrs. W. Jerry Capps of Atlanta. A forum for prominent theologians and scholars of religion, Capps Lectures address issues of faith, meaning and public life. This year's lecture was also a part of the Virginia Festival of the Book.
