


BONHOEFFER HOUSE

"Christianity is Madness: Kierkegaard and the University" with Stanley Hauerwas

Thursday, October 12th at 6pm the University of Virginia.

For nearly 50 years, Stanley Hauerwas has challenged Christians to live like Christians. Named "America's Best Theologian" by *Time* magazine, Hauerwas is the Gilbert T. Rowe Professor Emeritus of Divinity and Law at Duke University.

His work cuts across disciplinary lines—from ethics, theology and political theory, to medical ethics and the philosophy of social science.

Stanley Hauerwas's book, *A Community of Character: Toward a Constructive Christian Social Ethic*, was selected as one of the 100 most important books on religion of the 20th century. His recent works include *The Work of Theology* and *Hannah's Child: A Theological Memoir*.

The Capps Lectures in Christian Theology bring eminent Christian thinkers to the heart of the university to speak to the relationship between faith and responsibility. Vintage Intern | Sarah Ruckle, UVa '20


