1. Context

Yuree-rachen, "Circling Raven," was a shaman from the Middle Spokane tribe in the late 1700s. He had a personal crisis of faith in Creator after his son's untimely death, so he went to Mt. Spokane for a time of fasting and prayer. During this worship time, he received a vision from Creator, whom they called *Quilent-sat-men*, "He-Made-Us." In the vision, *Yuree-rachen* saw white men dressed strangely, carrying bundles of leaves fastened together. He was told that the people were to learn from the teachings inscribed on the leaves. *White men were unknown to these tribal people at that time*.

...invade, search out, capture, vanquish, and subdue all Saracens [Muslims] and *pagans* whatsoever, and other enemies of Christ wheresoever placed, and the kingdoms, dukedoms, principalities, dominions, possessions, and all movable and immovable goods whatsoever held and possessed by them and to *reduce their persons to perpetual slavery*, and to apply and appropriate to himself and his successors the kingdoms, dukedoms, counties, principalities, dominions, possessions, and goods, and to *convert them to his and their use and profit* (italics mine).

3. Indigenous & Colonial History

"Why should you take by force that from us which you can have by love? Why should you destroy us, who have provided you with food? What can you get by war? We can hide our provisions, and fly into the woods; and then you must consequently famish by wronging your friends. What is the cause of

your jealousy? You see us unarmed, and willing to supply your wants, if you will come in a friendly manner, and not with swords and guns, as to invade an enemy."

Others entered our world. They named things that had names. Created fields of power. Semantic, transformative power. They name us. The silences began when they "discovered" us, when we became Other. Homeland became wilderness; land virgin (read: *empty*). Inhabited land. They could own it. Doctrine of Discovery. They could take it. Degrees of humanity. We were now not quite human. Our past appeared in museums of natural history, with dinosaurs, insects, and rocks. Not in history museums, with stories of human beings. The illusion of dichotomy; *i.e.*, history begins when they arrive, is preceded by pre-history. Thousands of years of pre-history, excluded. Because they were not here. *Ipso facto*. Palimpsest: the covering of an ancient text by writing over it. In archaeology, the burial of a site by building on top of it. Call it the Americas.

4. Biblical Perspective
